The meaning of Christmas is made clear: the light shines in the darkness. It is in the liturgy that we encounter the Word made flesh—in the people of God gathered together as the body of Christ, and in the meal around the holy table. We go forth to be bearers of light as we proclaim this good news to all the ends of the earth.*

Call us out of darkness, and empower us to proclaim the birth of your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.**

**FIRST READING: ISAIAH 62:6-12**

*The prophet invites the people to give God no rest until God reestablishes Jerusalem. In turn, they will receive names full of promise: Holy People, the Redeemed of the Lord, a City Not Forsaken.*

<sup>6</sup>Upon your walls, O Jerusalem, I have posted sentinels;  
all day and all night they shall never be silent.

You who remind the LORD, take no rest,

<sup>7</sup>and give him no rest until he establishes Jerusalem  
and makes it renowned throughout the earth.

<sup>8</sup>The LORD has sworn by his right hand and by his mighty arm:  
I will not again give your grain to be food for your enemies,  
and foreigners shall not drink the wine for which you have labored;  
<sup>9</sup>but those who garner it shall eat it and praise the LORD,  
and those who gather it shall drink it in my holy courts.

<sup>10</sup>Go through, go through the gates, prepare the way for the people;  
build up, build up the highway, clear it of stones,  
lift up an ensign over the peoples.

<sup>11</sup>The LORD has proclaimed to the end of the earth:  
Say to daughter Zion, "See, your salvation comes;  
his reward is with him, and his recompense before him."

<sup>12</sup>They shall be called, "The Holy People, The Redeemed of the LORD";  
and you shall be called, "Sought Out, A City Not Forsaken."

**PSALM 97** Read responsively by verse

*Light dawns for the righteous, and joy for the honest of heart. (Ps. 97:11)*

<sup>1</sup>The LORD reigns; let the earth rejoice;  
let the multitude of the isles be glad.

<sup>2</sup>**Clouds and darkness surround the LORD,**  
**righteousness and justice are the foundations of God's throne.**

<sup>3</sup>Fire goes before the LORD, burning up enemies on every side.  
<sup>4</sup>**Lightnings light up the world; the earth sees and trembles.**  
<sup>5</sup>The mountains melt like wax before the Lord of all the earth.  
<sup>6</sup>**The heavens declare your righteousness, O LORD,  
and all the peoples see your glory.**  
<sup>7</sup>Confounded be all who worship carved images and delight in false  
gods! Bow down before the LORD, all you gods.  
<sup>8</sup>**Zion hears and is glad, and the cities of Judah rejoice,  
because of your judgments, O LORD.**  
<sup>9</sup>For you are the LORD, most high over all the earth;  
you are exalted far above all gods.  
<sup>10</sup>**You who love the LORD, hate evil!  
God guards the lives of the saints and rescues them from the  
hand of the wicked.**  
<sup>11</sup>Light dawns for the righteous, and joy for the honest of heart.  
<sup>12</sup>**Rejoice in the LORD, you righteous,  
and give thanks to God's holy name.**

#### **SECOND READING: TITUS 3:4-7**

*God saves us not because of what we do. Rather, God is a God of mercy and salvation who graciously cleanses us in baptism and renews our lives through the Holy Spirit.*

<sup>4</sup>When the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared,  
<sup>5</sup>he saved us, not because of any works of righteousness that we had done, but according to his mercy, through the water of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit. <sup>6</sup>This Spirit he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, <sup>7</sup>so that, having been justified by his grace, we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life.

#### **GOSPEL: LUKE 2:1- 20**

*The world's deep night is shattered by the light of God's new day. The glory of God is revealed to poor shepherds, who share the good news with others.*

<sup>1</sup>In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. <sup>2</sup>This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. <sup>3</sup>All went to their own towns to be registered.

<sup>4</sup>Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. <sup>5</sup>He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. <sup>6</sup>While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. <sup>7</sup>And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

<sup>8</sup>In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. <sup>9</sup>Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. <sup>10</sup>But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: <sup>11</sup>to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord.

<sup>12</sup>This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." <sup>13</sup>And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying,

<sup>14</sup>"Glory to God in the highest heaven,  
and on earth peace among those whom he favors!"

<sup>15</sup>When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us."

<sup>16</sup>So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. <sup>17</sup>When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; <sup>18</sup>and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. <sup>19</sup>But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. <sup>20</sup>The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.
